

The honorary prize of biomedical research ethics

In 2002, the committee system on biomedical research ethics instituted the honorary prize of biomedical research ethics. The prize is awarded every two years to a person, a group, an organisation or an enterprise whose efforts in the field of biomedical research ethics in relation to health and illness are outstanding and thought-provoking.

The prizewinner in 2010 was Professor, MD, consultant doctor Mikael Rørth, Department of Oncology, Rigshospitalet. Minister for the Interior and Health, Bertel Haarder handed over the prize.

The prizewinner in 2008 was Professor, MD, consultant doctor Gorm Greisen, Department of Neonatology, Rigshospitalet. Mr. Kristian Wendelboe, Permanent Secretary for the Ministry of Health and Prevention, handed over the prize.

The prizewinner in 2006 was the Danish Twin Registry at the University of Southern Denmark. Mr Christian Schønau, Permanent Secretary for the Ministry of Interior and Health, handed over the prize to Scientific Director of the Danish Twin Registry, Professor Kaare Christensen.

The prizewinner in 2004 was the Oncological Department D at Århus Hospital. Mr. Lars Løkke Rasmussen, Minister for the Interior and Health, handed over the prize to the department represented by the Director of Research, Professor Hans von der Maase.

The prizewinner in 2002 was Professor, MD Poul Riis, for many years Chairman of the National Committee on Biomedical Research Ethics.
